*Within the Ontario curriculum, opportunities for environmental education are provided in a number of compulsory and optional subject areas and courses as the following:*

- *Science and Technology, Grades 1-8 (1998)* relates knowledge and skills to environmental and sustainability issues
- In *Social Studies, Grade 1-6 and History and Geography, Grades 7 and 8 (2004)*, an understanding of the environment as the complex relationship between natural and built elements of the Earth
- In *Science, Grades 9 and 10 (1999) and Science, Grades 11 and 12*, curriculum expectations include relationship between science technology, society and the environment (\*)
